Hey Mike,
Here's a cross-tell message I'd like to share with anyone who's tired of chasing birds around the airfield....

Just wanted to let you in on a new product we at Grand Forks recently started using in our never-ending battle against our arch-nemesis, the cliff swallow. "BirdProof" Gel roost inhibitor, from Bird-X, comes in a standard 10" caulking tube, only costs \$95 per case (12), and will drive these pesky little critters away from your airfield...guaranteed. Anybody who's got em knows what a problem cliff swallows can be. Simply knocking down the nests has little/no effect. With mud available, these birds require less than a week to rebuild. Time spent each summer knocking down nests is considerable. Desperate for a better solution, we tried this "Bird-Proof" gel, and the results were nothing short of amazing. Birds do not like the smell of this stuff. You don't have to cover every sq. inch, just a little smear will do the trick. Buildings I've applied this stuff to in the beginning of May are still bird-free, so it looks like one application will last through the breeding season. (The manufacturer says it lasts up to a year) Success rate is almost 100%. This stuff isn't just for swallows, it apparently will work on a wide range of birds. You've got to check this product out! If you have as big a problem with birds roosting on your airfield as we have, I bet you'll be pleasantly surprised.
