comments: I recently tried Irri-tape on a pesky pigeon problem. So far (fingers crossed, knock on wood), it has been very successful.

For years, I have had a pair of pigeons roosting under the eaves of my house. The problem to easily finding a solution has been that they are roosting on the electric wires. (I put spikes on the downspout, and they moved to the wires.) At one point, one of the birds apparently died, and I thought the survivor had moved on to greener pastures. But the next year he was back---and with another partner! This year I moved upstairs. (This is a duplex that I own.) Being closer to my feathered "friends", I found that I could chase them away with a broom brandished out of one of the windows. However, that gets old very quickly. I found your site while searching the web for a solution and ordered the trial kit of the tape. When it came, I made streamers which I fastened to one of the wires enclosed. I then fastened the creation outside the window where it blows in the wind and glows in the sun. It actually looks rather decorative. The pigeons left. I occasionally see a pig!
